A. Cornelius Celsus (probably active fl. 25-45 CE under the emperors Tiberius, Caligula, and Claudius) was author of an encyclopedia *Artes*, of which the eight books *De Medicina* are extant. This bibliography will be updated.

Important General Studies to Celsus

Scheller, E. and W. Frieboes. 1906. *Aulus Cornelius Celsus: Über die Arzneiwissenschaft in acht Bücher*. 2nd ed. Braunschweig. It is astonishing that the only complete medical commentary on the text in a modern language remains this book. Scheller (Professor of Medicine and Surgery at Braunschweig) published his translation and commentary in 1846. Frieboes, while still a student who would later go on to become a dermatologist and professor at Berlin's Charité Hospital, published a second edition, revised after Charles Daremberg's 19th cen. Latin text. In spite of Frieboes' efforts, this effectively remains a book of the mid-19th cen.; see Ilberg's review from the *Berliner Philologische Wochenschrift* 27: 325-329.

Mudry, P. and G. Sabbah eds. 1994. *La médecine de Celse: aspects historiques, scientifiques et littéraires*. Sainte-Étienne. Proceedings of the only conference ever held dedicated to Celsus' *De Medicina*.

Schulze, C. 1999. *Aulus Cornelius Celsus — Artz oder Laie? Autor, Konzept und Adressaten der De medicina libri octo*. Trier.

Schulze, C. 2001. *Celsus*. Hildesheim. Most recent survey book. Pages 97-150 contain an exhaustive and thematically organized bibliography to Celsus reaching back into the 18th century. My bibliography is an update of recent materials to Schulze's bibliography, with only a few earlier pieces highlighted.

Mudry, P. 2006. *Medicina soror philosophiae. Regards sur la littérature et les textes médicaux antiques (1975-2005)*. Réunis et édités par Brigitte Maire. Lausanne. Collected essays in French from a leading authority on Celsus' *De Medicina*.

Gautherie, A. 2017. *Rhétorique et thérapeutique dans le De Medicina de Celse*. Turnhout. The newest monograph on Celsus, presents a major shift toward studying it as an encyclopedia, with cross-references, embedded authority, rhetoric.

Textual Issues

Marx, F. 1915. *A. Cornelii Celsi quae supersunt*. Corpus Medicorum Latinorum (=CML) I. Berlin. Available online at <http://cmg.bbaw.de/epubl/online/cml_01.php>. The standard critical text, this edition includes the testimonia and fragments for the rest of the *Artes*. Marx aimed to provide a philologically accurate representation of the manuscript evidence in the *apparatus criticus*, although he is a conservative and eclectic editor (so Helmreich 1917) in his main printed text.

Helmreich, G. 1917. "Zu Celsus," *Berliner Philologische Wochenschrift* 37: 1540-1541. The most important contemporary review of Marx 1915.

- Niedermann, M. 1933. "Helge Lyngby: Textkritiska studier till Celsus' medicina." *Gnomon* 9.8: 437-440. The important review of Lynby's critical notes on Marx's edition of Celsus; helpfully in German whereas Lyngby wrote in Swedish.
- Spencer, W.G. 1935-1938. *Celsus: De Medicina*. Loeb series. 3 vol. Cambridge, MA. Largely accurate translation that for the most part follows Marx's text (*Classical Review* 50.1 (1936): 27; 54.1 (1940): 31-32 note differences).
- Baader, Gerhard. 1960. "Überlieferungsprobleme des A. Cornelius Celsus," *Forschungen und Fortschritte* 34: 215-218. A useful discussion of Marx's stemma and editorial choices.
- Capitani, U. 1967, 1970. "Note critiche al testo del "De Medicina" di Celso," *Studi italiani di filologia classica* 39: 112-164; 42: 5-93. In these two lengthy articles building upon earlier work since Marx's edition Capitani proposed a series of emendations over the entire text: they are arranged in order of Celsus' work.
- Capitani, U. 1974. "Il recupero di un passo di Celso in un codice del *De Medicina* conservato a Toledo," *Maia* 26: 161-212. The Toledo supplement of *De Medicina* 4.27, unknown to Marx. Schulze 2001: 149 provides bibliography for the discussion of the passage's authenticity.
